The County Council is offering a free "Basic Introduction to the Internet" course in Longhirst Village Hall, probably starting in late February. It is aimed at absolute beginners, helping them to get online using a laptop or tablet. Attendees can also learn how to set up an e-mail account, stay in touch with friends and relatives using Facebook or Skype, shop online safely and search for information. There is no such thing as a silly question and trainers will try their best to include requests in the sessions which will last 2 hours and be held weekly over a period of 6 weeks. PARISH COUNCIL REPORT

Before the meeting took place on 3rd January the Parish Council received a brief presentation by Ronnie Baird from Enterpen Ltd. of Darlington. He explained that his Company intends to submit a **planning application** in February for the construction of 10 bungalows on the field immediately NW of the Village (Domino's field). Before then he will leaflet Village residents [this has now been done (Ed.)] and hold a public meeting in the Village Hall to outline his proposals.

Welcome Booklet: This is proving to be very popular with new residents and there has now been a reprint (see page 4).

Volunteers: A number of residents have put their names forward after the Remembrance Service to help with Parish Litter Picking, Sign Cleaning and Coffee Mornings.

Micklewood Parish Council Notice Board: this has been delivered and will be installed shortly.

It was agreed to increase the Parish Precept by 3% for 2019/20.

Peter Coates reported that he had met the Managing Director of Dere Street Homes together with Janet Quinn of the Micklewood Residents Association to discuss reopening the pedestrian access at the rear of Longhirst Hall. Dere Street agreed to consider the matter but a few days later responded by asking the Parish Council to agree to allow construction traffic for the proposed housing development on Dairy Lane to use the Lane itself. The developer has been advised that the Council cannot support such a proposal. Contact would be made with County Councillor David Towns to arrange a meeting between NCC Planners, Dere Street and the Parish Council to discuss the matter and attempt to find a resolution. Dere Street has erected a lift to serve the new apartments in the former hotel without planning approval and the lift structure rises well above the existing roofline. It is understood that NCC will insist that Dere Street apply for retrospective planning permission.

NCC Highway staff has recommended moving the existing 30mph sign at the south end of Longhirst further north and offered a number of options. After much discussion it was agreed to ask NCC to place a new 30mph sign immediately before The Lodge at the old entrance to Longhirst Hall together with a new 40mph sign where the existing 30mph sign is located. A new flashing speed warning sign should then be sited just after this new 30mph sign at the south end and another at the north end just before the first property on the east side of the main street.

A resident requested that a **mirror** be erected opposite the **entrance to Stable Close** because of the poor visibility when leaving the Close. It was pointed out that residents of the Close would have to erect the mirror and meet the costs themselves but it was agreed to consult NCC Highways on the matter.

Chris Marr reported that at present the costs of the **Village website** were being charged initially to a resident's credit card and it was agreed that a standing order should be opened for the Parish Council bank account to make the payment direct.

The **next Parish Council meeting** will be held at 7pm on **Thursday 7**th **March** and all residents are invited to attend.

MICKLEWOOD MATTERS

The Residents committee met with Kingston Property Services and Dere Street Homes on 16th November: this was a fairly positive meeting. The details of the meeting and suggestions for further discussion have been e-mailed round Micklewood residents and this has triggered a number of responses. Whilst things have been put on hold through Christmas and New Year a further meeting of the residents will be arranged in the near future to discuss these issues and agree a way forward.

Access to the Village continues to be a problem and various suggestions to the builders have failed to resolve it. The Parish Council are now looking to take the issue forward with Northumberland County Council.

The squirrel officer, Allan Scott (s), can regularly be seen about the estate and has recently trapped 48 greys. He is hoping that by controlling the grey squirrels the reds will return.

The Trustees are pleased to report that the internal redecoration has now been satisfactorily completed. They are currently in the process of replacing the damaged library fire escape door frame and are also planning to replace the front door and frame this spring.

Further plans include improving the loop system for the hard of hearing and seeking a capital grant from the National Lottery to upgrade the central heating system both in terms of the provision of hot water in the toilets and significantly improving the heating in the Sports Hall. The provision of a modern public address system is also being explored.
