PARISH COUNCIL REPORT



The meeting of the Parish Council scheduled to take place on Thursday 1st March was postponed because of bad weather. At the time of writing the rearranged meeting is to be held on Thursday 29th March at 7pm in the Village Hall.

The **Annual General Meeting** of the Parish Council will take place on **Thursday 3rd May** at 7pm in the Village Hall and all residents are invited to attend.

Parish Groups Meeting

The Chairmen and Secretaries (or their equivalents) of the Parish Council, the PCC, the Parish Association, the Garden Association and The Longhirst Leader met in late February.

It was recognised that by the end of this year the population of the Parish will have grown by approximately 60% since 2011, mainly because of the influx of residents into Micklewood Close and the new Longhirst Hall apartments. As a consequence, it was agreed that the time had come to reconsider how best to welcome new residents to the Parish and how to communicate most effectively with both existing and new households. Particular attention should be given to Mickewood Close, Longhirst Hall, The Colliery and outlying areas such as Ulgham Lane, High Steads and the caravan site.

The widespread perception is that Longhirst already has an active community (examples include numerous Church and Village Hall activities, the Open Gardens Weekends, the Village Show, the Litter Pickers and The Leader) but we need to demonstrate the value and enjoyment of community life and encourage more residents to become involved and give them a reason for doing so. One current problem is the closure of the pedestrian access preventing Micklewood (and shortly Longhirst Hall) residents gaining access to the Village and public transport.

Various actions were agreed including exploring means of circulating more paper copies of the Longhirst Leader as it was believed that these were more widely read than e-mail copies and updating the Parish website and combining this with the Open Gardens site. A welcome meeting would be arranged later this year for residents in the new Longhirst Hall apartments and a number of future Parish events were identified where the involvement of more residents would be encouraged.

RECIPE FROM VILLAGE HALL CELEBRATION EVENING

A number of people enjoyed the vegetarian dish so much that they asked for the recipe.

Sweet and Sour Tagine Serves four

1 large onion, thinly sliced

4 tbsp vegetable oil

50g butter

800g peeled butternut squash or pumpkin,

cut into 2.5cm dice

½ chilli, thinly sliced

4 tbsp chopped parsley

1 bayleaf

3 cardamom pods

1 tsp ground coriander

½ tsp ground nutmeg

½ tsp ground ginger

½ tsp ground turmeric

Small pinch saffron

2 cinnamon sticks

1/2 tbsp honey

Salt and pepper

Vegetable stock (or water)

150 - duited annitated alcanna

150g dried apricots, chopped

 $\frac{1}{2}$ preserved lemon, skin only, chopped

4 tbsp coriander, roughly chopped

2 tbsp pinenuts, roasted and roughly chopped

In a large, heavy saucepan, sauté the onion in oil and butter for 10 minutes, add the squash and cook for five minutes. Add the herbs, spices, honey, salt and pepper, cover with stock and simmer for 12 minutes.

Add the apricots and lemon, and cook for another 12 minutes, or until the squash is soft but doesn't mash

The sauce should have thickened slightly by now - if it's too runny, increase the heat to reduce. Stir in half the fresh coriander. Serve over couscous or rice, and garnish with pinenuts and the rest of the coriander.

GILL FEATONBY - THANK YOU, FAREWELL BUT NOT GOODBYE



Gill lived at Middle Moor for over 40 years but at the end of March she moves into William Turner Court (on the south bank of the river beside the Telford Bridge) in Morpeth.

She was born in Tynemouth in 1944. She started school in Monkseaton and then went to the Central High before obtaining a degree in Agricultural Zoology at Newcastle University. She always loved horses, started riding at the age of 8, was bought her own horse when she was 15 and continued to keep horses until very recently. She specialised in dressage and then endurance competitions but also bred foals from her stallion and taught others to ride. Over the years she has been Chairman, Secretary and

Treasurer of the Newcastle Riding Club and was the British Horse Society Access Officer for South Northumberland for 10 years.

Gill met David at Whitley Bay Round Table and they married in 1966. They started life together in Whitley Bay where David worked in the family business, Featonby Auctioneers. They wanted a house with more land, discovered Longhirst and Middle Moor and moved there in 1976. Gill kept horses, cows, sheep, chickens and geese, worked part time for David and part time at Oldgate Saddlers in Morpeth. Sadly David died in 2012 and Gill ran Featonby's for another 4 years until she was forced to sell when diagnosed with Aplastic Anaemia.

In addition to horses, Border Terriers have been a constant and important feature in Gill's life. She and David bought their first one soon after they married and owned 4, all from the same breeder. If you see Gill you can almost guarantee that Pip (her current Terrier) is not far away! As soon as they moved to Longhirst David and Gill were encouraged to join in Village life by Jimmy Moore and they both contributed a great deal to the Community. Gill was a member of the Parish Council for many years, Secretary of the Garden Association for nearly 25 years, Chairman of the Parish Association from its conception around 2000 and has been one of the chefs for the Luncheon Club since it started after the refurbishment of the Village Hall.

In recognition of her work Gill has been made Honorary Life President of both the Parish Association and the Garden Association. The latter means that she will still be able to enter the Village Show even though she will be living in Morpeth. She will not have a garden to grow vegetables but we look forward to her continuing to enter the other classes. She is sad to leave Longhirst but is looking forward to her future. She expects to be a frequent visitor to the Village and will continue to cook for the Luncheon Club.

We wish her every happiness in her new home and thank her for all her contributions to Longhirst life.

VICAR'S LETTER - PRACTICAL CHRISTIANITY

On March 5th Dorothy McMillan, who is Churchwarden at St. John's, and myself represented the Longhirst Parish at an award ceremony in North Shields. It took place at the Cedarwood Trust which is a Community Outreach Centre for the Meadowell estate. Originally established by the Church of England, Cedarwood offers community facilities and support in one of the most economically and socially deprived areas in North Tyneside. Representatives from St. John's had been invited along to receive one of Cedarwood's "Golden Fleece" awards as a thank-you for the support we have given the trust over many years. Every year at the beginning of December on Advent Sunday we hold a "Toy Service" where those who wish to attend are invited to bring a Christmas present. All the presents collected at the service are then sent to Cedarwood for distribution to families which otherwise might provide very little for their children to enjoy at Christmas. Last year we sent 169 parcels kindly supplied by supporters from Longhirst, Pegswood, Bothal and beyond. The young peoples' uniformed organisations in Pegswood and Morpeth are especially enthusiastic supporters. The award was for everyone involved.

The ceremony was attended by representatives from several organisations which support Cedarwood, among them the local Police. In conversation with two of their officers afterwards it was pressed upon us how important these presents are to so many families on the estate each Christmas and they had seen, on the ground as it were, how much of a difference it made. In the light of this, our annual Advent Toy Service is not an optional extra in the calendar but goes to the heart of what we are about. Jesus' haunting words in St. Matthew's Gospel come to mind, "See that you do not look down on one of these little ones. For I tell you that their angels in heaven are always in the presence of my Father in heaven."
