OPEN GARDENS WEEKEND SATURDAY 22nd and SUNDAY 23rd JUNE. 11AM - 5PM



It's nearly time for Open Gardens Weekend which is a lovely occasion and a great chance to meet people and get to know more about the Village. It is also the largest event we hold!

There will be eleven gardens open to visit as well as other attractions including vintage cars, a model railway, Wansbeck Garden Centre plant stall and of course excellent lunches and teas at the Village Hall. We are also delighted that Sean Murray and his wife Eilleen are coming. Sean was the

winner of the BBC Great Chelsea Garden Challenge in 2015 and as a result in 2016 designed a garden for the RHS Chelsea Flower Show. Sean now has his own design business 'Garden Narratives' and the Community Garden in the centre of Pegswood is one of his achievements. Sean will be at Barnacre Garden to open the event on the Saturday morning and then available in Dairy Cottage garden on both days during the afternoon.

To celebrate the start of the Weekend St John's Church will be holding a Songs of Praise service on Friday 21st at 7pm to which everyone is invited. The Church will also be open to visitors. There will be live music, the opportunity to light memorial candles and to view a power point presentation compiled by Sean Murray of 'Gardens, Before and After'.

The ticket price is £5 per adult per day with accompanied children free. Well-behaved dogs are welcome. Full details can be found on www.longhirstopengardens.org.

PARISH COUNCIL REPORT



The AGM held on 2nd May was notable as it was the last meeting for our longstanding Parish Clerk, Ian Thompson. The Chairman, Catherine Farrell

thanked him very warmly for his lengthy service, both as a Councillor and as Clerk, and made a presentation on behalf of Parish Council Chairmen and Members past and



present. She also introduced our new Clerk, Helyn Douglas (see photo) from Guide Post, who has been Clerk to Humshaugh Parish Council for 4 years.

Having presented her Annual Review Catherine was re-elected as Chairman and,

as Richard Tordoff was standing down as Vice Chairman, Peter Coates was elected in his place. The expenditure for 2018/19 and the budget for 2019/20 were then discussed. Details will be published on the Council website shortly.

Peter Coates reported that he is meeting Rob Murfin, the new Head of Planning at NCC, early in June to discuss the **pedestrian access at the rear of Longhirst Hall**. Ian Thompson has been notified that NCC has granted **retrospective planning permission for the external lift** at the Hall.

The Council has lodged an objection to the planning application for an anaerobic digestor at North East Grains because of the lack of information over increased traffic levels, noise, smells, etc. Concern was also expressed over the proposed size of the facility which may well become one of the largest digestors in the region.

An objection has also been submitted to the application for 10 new bungalows in Domino's Field. The applicant is claiming that the site is infill development and had previously been used as a storage site for the Butterwell Opencast. The Council has refuted both these statements and pointed out that the Field is clearly "high contribution" green belt in the new NCC Local Plan. Longhirst Village is a Conservation Area and we do not wish to see the boundaries extended.

The **Open Gardens** organisers requested that the Council make a grant of £200 towards the cost of signage for the event and this was approved.

The installation of a **defibrillator** at, or near, the Village Hall is being actively investigated. The various options include purchase or leasing and the possibility of taking over the Village phone box to house the unit.

County Councillor David Towns advised the Council that the B1337 between the Church and the Hebron turn is scheduled to be closed from 18^{th} - 20^{th} June from 8am and 4pm, although work may take place outside these dates. This will allow "micro resurfacing" to take place. The need for repairs to the road out of the Village towards Linton has also been reported.

Chris Marr and Ray Robson are undertaking a major overhaul of the **Village website**. More information is already available and further improvements are forthcoming. They will prepare a report on the financial implications for regular maintenance of the site shortly.

The next meeting will be held in the Village Hall at 7pm on Thursday 4th July and all residents are invited to attend.

IAN THOMPSON



Ian Thompson has retired from his position as Parish Clerk having held the post for over 20 years. Prior to that he was a Parish Councillor for 16 years. He was born in the Village in 1946 and lived with his parents, Nancy and Tom and his elder brother, Keith, at No. 8 on the main street. He attended Longhirst School until he was 11 and then went to KEVI High School in Morpeth. He trained to become a teacher in Durham where he met Val and they married in 1968.

Ian and Val set up home in Cramlington and then bought No. 10 The Village in 1974. Ian taught history in Longbenton, Newcastle and then at Hirst High School in Ashington. His interest in the history of Longhirst was

kindled when he was given the records not only of their new home but also of other nearby properties. Over the years he has researched the archives relating to the Village and Longhirst Hall and has written around 20 booklets. He has also given a variety of talks to local and professional groups and The Northumbrian magazine has published an article by him on the history of cricket at Longhirst Hall. He is very much the "go to man" for matters relating local history!

Ian became a member of the Parish Council in 1974 and stood down in 1990 after he and Val moved to Felton, where Val ran the post office. They returned to Longhirst in 1998 and moved into No.9. Ian was almost immediately appointed as Parish Clerk. Around this time he retired from teaching and worked part time as an educational IT rep until he fully retired in 2006.

Ian has always been very active in Village life. He joined the Church choir at a tender age and became a bell ringer when he was 11. He started to maintain the Churchyard in 1953 and, apart from his time in Felton, has helped to do so ever since. He is currently Chairman of the Parish Association, a member of a Luncheon Club cooking team, one of our highly valued Litter Pickers and generally helps out with numerous Village activities including the Church Fete and Open Gardens. He and Val have held fund raising events for diabetes and organise the Macmillan Coffee Mornings. Last year he helped to arrange a reunion for former pupils at Longhirst School with 44 attending.

Ian and Val plan to leave Longhirst to be nearer their son Mark and his family. In the meantime he can still be seen working around the Parish and walking his dog. We hope they will be very happy in their next home and wish them all the very best for the future. They will both be sadly missed and we sincerely hope that they will make regular return visits.

The conservation carried out in the Parish has been very positive with a significant number of Greys being culled since I started back at the end of October. A big thank you to everyone who monitors traps and allows me to trap on their land and premises. I am also grateful to those who have forwarded sightings to the Morpeth & District Red Squirrel (MADRS) site. It really makes a difference.

On the down side we have had a live trap stolen from the un-fenced area within Longhirst Hall grounds. MADRS take these thefts very seriously as do Northumbria Police who have been informed so that they can carry out their own investigation.

We were delighted to present him with a gift of £700 from all three Churches and communities and wished him well for the next chapter in his ministry. How fortunate his new parishioners in North Shields will be. I expect many of you will always remember fondly Lee's approachability, personal warmth, engaging personality,

all in all a great ambassador for the Christian faith. Many will also appreciate the time and attention he has offered to individuals and families, with great empathy, both in good times and in bad. Whether in conversation perhaps over lunch at Longhirst Village Hall, enjoying a game of darts or football at the young people's activities on a Tuesday evening or entering his scones in competition at the Longhirst Village Show, Lee has wholeheartedly involved himself in the community in so many ways.

Lee gave his last sermon to us on the Easter theme of the resurrection appearance of Christ to the disciples who had gathered behind locked doors in Jerusalem, during which he made one simple observation. He pointed out the irony that whereas the tomb where Jesus' body had lain was now open, the stone having been rolled away, the doors behind which Jesus' fearful followers cowered were well and truly locked. The challenge is to unlock doors of our hearts and let Christ in. Lee's generous openness to everyone, whoever they may be has set an example of resurrection faith to us all and will be a great strength wherever he serves in the future.
