

VILLAGE HALL NEWS

We are pleased to report that the project to upgrade the central heating and hot water systems and to install a fully insulated suspended ceiling with new LED dimmable lighting panels in the Sports Hall is now complete. We have sent out the press release to



all the local papers and submitted the final account to Suez and we understand the last tranche of funding will be in our account shortly.



We have also installed three additional electrical sockets in the Sports Hall, fitted a new projection screen purchased by the Village Show Association and hung new curtains and curtain rails with funds donated by a U3A member who has moved away from the area. We have also installed wi-fithanks to the Parish Council and purchased the new Gazebo funded by the Village Show Association. There remains some work to provide storage and display facilities for the large amount of historical material left to us by Ian

Thompson and Gill Featonby. We hope this will be erected in the Library and decisions about this will be made soon.

PARISH COUNCIL REPORT



The Parish Council annual general meeting was held on 18th May by Zoom and followed the local elections.

The new Council consists of Chris Marr, Janet Quinn, Jon Mills, Richard Tordoff, Glen Fahy, Peter Lovering and Peter Coates with Peter Coates being elected Chairman and Chris Marr Vice Chairman. Helyn Douglas is the Clerk to the Council.

The Chairman's Annual report referred to the effect of the Covid 19 pandemic including the unfortunate need to resort to Zoom meetings for a protracted period. Hopefully normal service can be resumed as soon as possible!

He thanked Diane Milmore, Fiona Smith and Kathleen Robson for providing their emergency shopping service for confined residents and the Longhirst Litter Pickers who have now provided a monthly service for 18 years. Also mentioned were Lawrence and Anne Carey who tend the flower tubs in the centre of the Village and, together with North East Grains, provide a printing service for the production of the Longhirst Leader. Other notable achievements included the NCC speed reduction scheme and the new Village nameplate signs, the successful introduction of the North East Grains liaison meetings and the rejection of the planning application for Domino's Field.

Outstanding issues include the flooding of the Ashington Road, the condition of the Butcher's Lane footpath and the lack of a pedestrian access between the Village and Micklewood Close.

David Towns was congratulated on his re-election as our **County Councillor** and he reported that he is to examine local highway problem sites with Martin King from NCC Highways including the Butcher's Lane footpath and the state of the gullies.

Andy Robson, on behalf of **Longhirst Hall residents**, described recent problems with the developers constructing the two new dwellings on Dairy Lane. Subcontractors installing a drainage system succeeded in bursting a water main, causing supplies to homes over a large area being cut off for several hours. Only efforts by local residents prevented one house from being flooded out. It is understood that the subcontractors have now been replaced but concerns over the general lack of progress remain.

Janet Quinn mentioned potential problems for disabled users of the proposed Micklewood pedestrian access and Glen Fahy highlighted the number of obstructions to public rights of way at Potland Park and Advance Northumberland's failure to respond to complaints about them.

Jon Mills is commencing his inspection of public rights of way throughout the Parish with the assistance of Jenny Ames and Dave Wiggett and Peter Coates intends to hold an open meeting to discuss the Parish Wildlife Project once Covid restrictions are lifted.

The **next meeting** of the Parish Council will hopefully be held in person in the Village Hall on **Thursday 1**st **July at 7pm**. As it was not possible to meet in the Village Hall for the annual meeting in May all residents are invited to come along and raise any matters that they wish including voicing any comments on the Parish Council 3 Year Strategic Plan which is published on the Council website (x).

NORTH EAST GRAINS/ LONGHIRST PARISH COUNCIL LIAISON MEETING

The meeting held on 23rd April was attended by Matthew Curry (MD for NEG), County Councillor David Towns and Parish Councillors Chris Marr and Peter Coates.

Matthew reported that NEG has no current proposals to proceed with the installation of the Anaerobic Digester as grain prices and the level of energy tariffs mean that such a plant will be uneconomic for the time being. They have also decided not to commission the required advance archaeological survey at this stage.

They are planning to employ one or two additional operatives shortly and the posts will be advertised.

The board of directors has agreed that for safety reasons all grain delivering trailers at harvest time will be required to have automatic tailgates by harvest 2022, this is something the cooperative have been working towards.

The Parish representatives asked that the wording on the sign "requesting" drivers of grain lorries to turn right out of the plant be changed to read "must turn right". This was agreed.

It was noted that NCC plan to spend £90,000 repairing the road between the Village and the plant in the next few months. David Towns agreed to speak to officers at County Hall to try to ensure that the work is carried out at a time that minimises NEG and other road traffic disruption.

CHANGES TO CHURCH WEDDINGS

On 4th May new rules around the registration of marriages came into force which have changed the system in place since the introduction of civil registration in 1837. This new system moves away from the familiar recording of marriages in the two bound registers which are signed by couples and their witnesses during the wedding service and which are currently kept in parish churches. Replacing the registers will be a single "marriage document" recording the couples' details and witness' signatures in much the same way as the registers did but which, after the wedding ceremony, is then sent to the local register office and that then forms the basis of a digital online registration of the marriage by the registry. Couples will then have to apply to their local register office for their wedding certificate.

What happens to the current registers? The registers currently kept in the parish church will be formally closed and then one of them sent to the local register office and the other one archived. This means therefore that anyone married before 4th May this year and wishing to obtain a duplicate copy of their marriage certificate, will in future have to apply to their local register office, as parish churches will no longer issue them.

These new arrangements will not affect in any way the content of the marriage service itself nor will it change the so called "preliminaries" so banns will still be read, or in some cases a marriage licence obtained and wedding preparation for couples by their minister will happen as usual.
